COUNTY COMMISSIONERS CONFERENCE 2023


On 25th and 26th April 2023 KGGA held a virtual Girl Guide County Commissioners'. Conference with representation from 30 Counties. The aim of the conference was to induct the Commissioners on the Associations Mandate, Strategic Goals, Projects, Fundamental Girl Guiding Principles, Projects and the Commissioner's Roles and Responsibilities. 9 new County Commissioners from Embu, Garissa, Homabay, Isiolo, Kitui, Muranga, Meru, Nyandarua and Vihiga Counties and 2 Regional Girl Guide Commissioners from Coast and Central Regions were appointed.





WAGGGS 39TH CONFERENCE

The WAGGGS 29th World Conference will be held in Cyprus from 26th to 31st August 2023. KGGA has registered two members of the Executive Committee to attend the Conference. AWARDS

June 23rd 2023 was a special day where Mrs Alice Waweru (WAGGGS Senior Member Organisation Partner) was presented with WAGGGS Medal of Service Award at the KGGA Headquarters. We celebrate her!

The WAGGGS Medal of Service is the highest form of recognition that WAGGGS can bestow. It is awarded to individuals whose service to Girl Guiding/Girl Scouting is considered to be exceptional, noteworthy and/or extraordinary in nature, and deemed to be over and above what could normally be expected of an individual fulfilling that particular job/role. The individual must be "in good standing" with WAGGGS and have made an exceptional contribution in terms of time, expertise, talents, resources and/or influence to enable WAGGGS to achieve its Mission and/or Objectives.











MADARAKA DAY 2023

The 2023 Madaraka Day Celebrations were held at the Moi Stadium in Embu County and KGGA was represented by the Chief Commissioner Prof. Faith Nguru, the County Commissioners Representative Harriet Muchiri and the KGGA Embu County Commissioner, Pauline Kariuki. Rainbows, brownies, Girl Guides, Rangers and Young Leaders took part in the March Past Parade.





PARTNERSHIPS

KGGA and Pan African Climate Justice Alliance (PACJA) on 31st May 2023 signed a Memorandum of Understanding to develop and reinforce mutual cooperation, collaboration, and implementation of various initiatives in favor of Young Girls and Women.

KGGA and PACJA agreed to utilize PACJA's evidence-informed advocacy work in Climate Change as an anchor in KGGA priority areas, and participation in Climate Change platforms particularly those that relate to Girls and Young Women among other understands. The KGGA management team led by the National Executive Officer visited the PACJA offices at Jamhuri Crescent off Kabarnet Road Nairobi for the signing of the MoU.





KGGA HEADQUARTERS EMPOWERMENT CENTRE

Construction of phase one of the Empowerment Centre is almost complete. Officials from the State department of Youth visited the KGGA headquarters in May to inspect progress. The next phase will be furnishing and equipping the centre. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to be signed between KGGA and the Ministry of Youth, Sports and the Arts on the operations/management of the facility.





PROGRAMMES AND TRAINING *MEMBERSHIP STATUS*

Membership recruitment has continued across the board with new schools being recruited through the Membership Growth Project. There is a significant increase in the number of new schools registering in counties that have been hard to reach such as Kajiado, Garissa, Bungoma, Kilifi among others. MEMBERSHIP GROWTH PROJECT

In partnership with World Guide Foundation, the Association has embarked on a national roll out for membership recruitment in 8 more counties that include Kilifi, Kajiado, Bungoma, Kakamega, Kisumu, Laikipia, Meru and Garissa. The target is to recruit 239,496 new Girls and Young Women in schools, churches and communities. A total number of 748 schools were mapped out in the 8 counties for the phase 2 implementation. Virtual sensitization meetings for the head teachers in the mapped schools were conducted from 11th to 14th April 2023. The County Directors of Education, Teachers Service Commission Directors and KGGA Board members were present during the meetings.

The Association appointed 8 Field Officers to coordinate activities in the 8 counties. The Guide Leader trainings were conducted in May and early June in all the 8 implementing counties. The County Directors of Education and TSC County Directors supported the training by officially opening/closing the Guide Leader's trainings. The table below shows the number of Guide Leaders trained versus the targets per county.

The trained Guide Leaders will recruit 130 girls into the Guiding movement in different KGGA branches and also recruit another teacher to assist in managing the girls in the units. We had male teachers attending trainings especially from Garissa as some schools had no female teachers.

During the April school holidays, Field Officers recruited girls in 4 open units in Marsabit, Nairobi, Mombasa and Kiambu counties. These were;

- 1. Anglican Church of Kenya (ACK) Kingeero Church Kiambu County
- 2. Masjildul Ar- Rashad Madrassa Marsabit County
- 3. Mnga'ro Mtaani Nairobi County.
- 4. Minto Childrens' home Mombasa County.

In this Quarter Guide Leaders have recruited girls in the Rainbow, Brownie, Girl Guide and Ranger Guide units and being assisted by the Field Officers to also recruit another teacher in the school. Recruitment of Girls in the 8 new counties started in June after the Guide Leaders were trained. Young Leaders have also been recruited by the Field officers as per the table:






Fig 21. Guides from Kapsimotwa Preparatory in Nandi County training their ECD class on oral health

LEARNING CAMPS

In the past quarter, Kenya Girl Guides Association (KGGA) organized and conducted highly successful learning camps in various counties across the country. These camps provided a unique opportunity for 664 Guides and Rangers to engage in enriching experiences and enhance their personal and leadership skills.

The learning camps took place in eight different counties, including Nyeri, Nairobi, Kiambu, Mombasa, Kwale, Bomet, Makueni, and Marsabit. Each camp was carefully designed to offer a diverse range of educational activities, outdoor adventures, team-building exercises, and opportunities for personal growth.

YOUNG LEADERS REPORT

A total of 127 Young Leaders have been recruited and are fully paid-up members. Out of those who have paid up membership fee, 56 have been trained on Introduction to Girl Guiding. They have participated in several activities during the quarter including:

BEACH CLEAN-UP ACTIVITIES

United Nations Environmental Program (UNEP) in collaboration with the British High Commission organized a post-World Environment Day Beach clean-up at Early Bird Banda Nyali, Mombasa County. A team of KGGA Young Leaders from the Coastal Region who are champions of the Tide Turners project took part in the event. In attendance were the British High Commissioner, Kenya Wildlife Service, Mombasa County Government, National Environment Management Authority of Kenya (NEMA), United Nations-HABITAT, Go Blue Initiative, and Baus Taka amongst other stakeholders.

The Plastic Tide Turners Advocacy Champion from Mombasa County also attended a community clean-up in the Brazil area of Likoni. The clean-up was organized by Phoenix Eco Plastic Systems (PEPS) and Go Green.

On World Turtle Day, the Young Leaders from Kilifi County in the Coastal Region attended an event at Turtle Bay Beach sponsored by A Rocha Kenya. They were joined by teams from Kenya Wildlife Services, Eco World Recycling, One Child Kenya, Medina Palms staff and Crab Shack Conservation. The team managed to collect plastics along the Indian Ocean.



Subsequently she was invited for the National Climate Change Action Plan (NCCAP) workshop that took place in Nyeri for 3 days having taken part in the Development of the Climate Change Disaster Risk Model (CCDRM) organized by the Climate directorate with UNICEF and The German Agency for International Cooperation (GIZ).



KGGA was represented by Violet Adhiambo, a Plastic Tide Turner Advocacy Champion at the UNEP side event at ECOSOC Youth Forum 2023 happening in New York.

The side event focused on "Choking in plastic: Addressing water pollution to ensure the right to a healthy environment and the achievement of SDG 6 for youth." Violet spoke on the role of young people in influencing and changing their lifestyles which can lead to plastic pollution-free waterways and the achievement of SDG6.



THE JULIETTE LOW SEMINAR

The JLS 2022, started in October last year and the participants are in the last phase where they are delivering the 100 Girls Project.

- 17 participants have delivered their projects in different counties in Kenya, Ghana, and Rwanda (as two are YESS Participants).
- 4 participants have received 100 girls' project grants from WAGGGS.
- 15 Participants and 2 volunteers will be traveling to the different world centres from August December. (7 participants to Kusafiri (Ghana), 4 participants to Sangam and 2 participants to Pax Lodge).
- 2 JLS volunteers will be going to Ghana and Pax Lodge to help in the delivery of the Leadership Events.
- 1 JLS core team member is part of the Learning Design group that is the WAGGGS Leadership Events.

INTERNATIONAL DAY AGAINST DRUG ABUSE AND ILLICIT TRAFFICKING (IDADA)

A total of 27 Girl Guides, 1 Brownie and 15 Young Leaders attended the commemoration of the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking (IDADA) whose theme was People first: stop stigma and discrimination, strengthen prevention. Celebrated each year on June 26th, the UN Office on Drugs and Crime uses the commemorative day to highlight the dangers of drug use and their illegal trade and provides educational material to teachers and public officials all over the world. The event was graced by Dr. Raymond Omollo, the Ps. Ministry of Interior and National Administration who committed to partner with stakeholders and parties of interest to end the existential dread of production, distribution and consumption of illicit brews and hard drugs.

YOUTH EXCHANGE SOUTH TO SOUTH

The Youth Exchange South to South (YESS) Girls Movement is an international exchange Programme for Young Women (Girl Guides) aged 18-25 years old and 25- 35 years for professionals.

This year, Kenya Girl Guides Association received 5 girls from Rwanda, Bangladesh, Zimbabwe, Uganda, and Madagascar. KGGA also sent a team of 6 girls to Rwanda, Nepal, Madagascar (Fanilo), Madagascar (Mpanasava), Ghana and Uganda (WAGGGS).

From 3rd to 7th April 2023, the YESS team participated in World Health Week with the theme 'Health for All'. 

The sessions also included a focus on enhancing individual beauty and self-confidence through makeup techniques. With this campaign, girls are being equipped to pursue economic opportunities and create a brighter future for themselves.







CELEBRATING MENSTRUAL HYGIENE MANAGEMENT DAY

The Menstrual Hygiene Management Day was celebrated by the Kenya Girl Guides Association with various activities and events. Activity packs were shared among Guiding groups, encouraging participation and support from teachers, field officers, and Young Leaders. The event was honored by the presence of Madam Elizabeth Okinda Tumm from the Nairobi Governor's office, who recognized the importance of teaching young girls about menstrual health and hygiene.

In Taita Taveta County, a collaborative effort took place at Mambura primary school, involving the Ministry of Health, Kenya Red Cross Society, Mgeno Ranch, Stawisha Pwani, Office of the DCC Mwatate, Gender office, and other partners. The Deputy Governor, H.E Christine Kilalo, emphasized the significance of adolescent education and the need to keep girls in school. The event also included the administration of COVID-19 vaccinations and the provision of dignity packs to learners.
